

Orthopedic Impairment

An "orthopedic impairment" is a severe physically disabling condition that adversely affects educational performance. The term may include impairments caused by any of the following:

- (1) A congenital anomaly.
- (2) A disease, such as:
 - (A) poliomyelitis; or
 - (B) bone tuberculosis.
- (3) Other causes, such as:
 - (A) cerebral palsy;
 - (B) amputations; or
 - (C) fractures or burns that cause contractures.
